When swarms occur, the honey bees can remain at the "muster" point from which they send out hundreds of scout bees to look for a permanent cavity (nesting place) in which to relocate the swarm to. They can remain at the "muster" point for 2 minutes, 2 hours or 2 days or any length of time in between. On some occasions, the scouts cannot find a suitable new home so they remain there and start building comb. So it is important you contact someone as soon as possible to remove the swarm .

Unless specified, there is no fee for the capture of a swarm. However, you should verify with the person you contact to retrieve the swarm.
